

College Acceptance!












Guest Speakers

JAG State Career Development Conference


Once again the winners from our local JAG Career Development Conference took part in the State Competition, facing off with winners from the other 12 Regions in our state.

Sullivan High School students witnessed first-hand the reality and consequences of impaired driving, at the scene of a mock drunk-driving crash, held Friday afternoon at the high school.

The teen audience saw firefighters extricate fellow students from the mangled vehicles, just before they were taken away in waiting ambulances.

Student volunteers played the part of injured victims.

Emergency crews from the Sullivan City Fire Department, Sullivan County Ambulance Service and Air Evac Lifeteam were joined by officials from the Sullivan County Sheriff's Office, Sullivan City Police, and Indiana State Police.

Students remained quiet, as Southwest School Corporation Chief Jim Dotson narrated the event.

The Chief stressed to students to have a "safe ride", pre-planned well before getting into a vehicle with an intoxicated driver.
